Succulent figure

Materials:

Green polymer clay Pink polymer clay Brown polymer clay Chalk pastels

Tools:

Blade
Dotting tool
Paintbrush

Instructions:

- 1. Form a large ball of pink clay into a cone and press onto your surface to create a flat top and bottom. This will be your plant pot. This shape should be approximately 20mm (¾in) tall and 20mm (¾in) at its widest part.
- **2.** Add a thin circle of brown clay to the top of the plant pot shape. Use a large dotting tool to create lots of shallow holes to add a soil texture.
- 3. Roll out a sheet of pink clay 2mm (1/1ein) thick and cut a long thin rectangle. Wrap this around the top of the plant pot to create a rim. Cut off any excess clay.
- **4.** Add a face to the plant pot using brown clay and chalk pastels.
- **5.** Take a small ball of green clay and gently pinch one side with your fingers, then flatten it to create a leaf shape.
- **6.** Repeat this multiple times, making sure you have leaves of varying sizes.
- **7.** Now add these to the top of the plant pot on the brown clay starting with the largest leaves at the bottom: they should get smaller as you add them near the top.
- 8. Shade the ends of the leaves with a red chalk pastel and a paintbrush. Be gentle so that you don't ruin the shape of your succulent leaves.
- 9. Bake the succulent and allow to cool.



You can use the plant pot base to make all kinds of succulent and cactus figures – get creative!
