


Really Quick Penguin

Materials:

10g (1/3oz) white sugarpaste
10g (1/3oz) black sugarpaste
Small amount of yellow
sugarpaste

Tools:

Square cutter: 2.5cm (1in)
No. 2 piping tube



Instructions:

- 1 Roll out the black sugarpaste. Make a tiny ball of yellow sugarpaste and press it on to the black. Cut out a black square with the cutter, cutting through the yellow on the corner of the square – this will form the beak. Mark on two eyes with the piping tube.
- 2 For the Penguin's body, shape a cone from the white sugarpaste. The length needs to be shorter than the diagonal of the square. Stand the cone up on its base.
- 3 Cover the cone with the black sugarpaste square with the yellow beak over the head first. The wings and tail can be left curved out or tweaked until the model resembles a penguin!
