


Metal Clay Jewellery

This gorgeous guide to metal clay jewellery, written by jewellery designer Natalia Coman, features silver, copper and bronze clays. The book is divided up by technique, such as 'Making connections after firing', 'Setting stones' and 'Working with colour'. It contains 17 jewellery projects including rings, pendants, earrings, bracelets and decorative clasps: it is thorough enough to lead a beginner through the process from start to finish, but innovative enough to inspire ever experienced jewellen-make s.
